Chief Lanier was named Chief of the Metropolitan Police Department by DC Mayor Adrian Fenty and officially assumed the leadership position in January of 2007. She holds a Bachelor's and Master's Degree in Management from Johns Hopkins University, and a Master's Degree in National Security Studies from the Naval Postgraduate School in Monterey, California.

In November 2006, Mr. Persichini was designated by Director Robert S. Mueller as the Assistant Director in Charge of the Washington Field Office. Mr. Persichini joined the FBI in September of 1976, as a professional support employee and was appointed as a Special Agent in June 1980, where he was assigned to the Alexandria, Virginia Office. He subsequently served in the Denver and the New York City Field Offices. Mr. Persichini is considered one of the FBI's experts in law enforcement corruption and has been involved in law enforcement corruption training throughout the US.
